Area 4: UF Policies Shaping This Course

This course is aligned with the UF policies below.

- <u>Contact Hours</u>: "Contact Hours" refers to the hours per week in which students are in contact with the instructor, excluding office hours or other voluntary contact. The number of contact hours in this course equals the number of credits the course offers.
- <u>Workload:</u> As a Carnegie I, research-intensive university, UF is required by federal law to assign at least 2 hours of work outside of class for every contact hour. Work done in

these hours may include reading/viewing assigned material and doing explicitly assigned individual or group work, as well as reviewing notes from class, synthesizing information in advance of exams or papers, and other self-determined study tasks.

- Attendance is mandatory for this synchronous online course, and will be encouraged through daily quizzes and participation activities. As a flipped classroom, we expect to use most of our class time for discussion and activities to reinforce concepts, reviewing concepts, and doing examples.
- Graded work will be turned in through Canvas assignments, and in some cases like homework will require scanning your written problem-solving notes, or otherwise converting any electronic notes, into a single PDF file per assignment for uploading.
